

Instructions

- I. Activate knowledge by watching the <u>BrainPop Jr. Video on Landforms</u>
- 2. Decide which landform you want to research in detail. Choose a landform and click the link to read about it.

<u>Mountain</u> <u>Desert</u> <u>Valley</u> <u>Plain</u> <u>Plateau</u> <u>Coast</u> (You can also gain more knowledge on <u>Landforms</u> using Pebble Go)

- 3. Fill out the <u>Graphic Organizer</u> about your landform to apply the Knowledge learned.
- 4. Imagine you just found out that your family is moving to an area where the landform you researched is located. Write a narrative about your experience, making sure to mention facts you recorded about the landform. Look over your work to make sure that you stay on topic, include two or more events, include details about the events, use temporal words to signal event order, and provide a sense of closure.
- 5. Turn your written story into an interactive story using Story Jumper.
- 6. You will present your story on the Smart Board to the class.
